






Who helps us learn and grow?



# The Worldwide Church




## **The Diocese of Rochester has links with Kondoa in Tanzania**

The Diocese is the poorest diocese in Tanzania. Electricity is gradually being installed and is sometimes available in Kondoa Town. Elsewhere the villages have no mains electricity and no running water supply. Churches in the UK support some projects such as running schools and a bee keeping project.

The Diocese of Truro links with the church in Sweden.

The Church of Sweden has 4 million members (almost 70 per cent of the population). There are 3500 churches in Sweden, and 13 dioceses. Each diocese is led by a bishop, whose tasks include training vicars and curates, and visiting every parish.
