Our Learning This Week

In English this week, Year 4 have been writing their own stories about terrifying monsters based on 'Black Dog.' In the children's stories, their characters have been beset by creatures with red, bulgy eyes, one single tooth in a huge mouth and gigantic spikes covering their whole body. Horror of horrors, there has even been a giant goose on the loose!

Our Maths work has focused on the properties of 2D shapes and angles. In particular, the children have learnt how to use a protractor to measure angles and to sort them into acute, right, obtuse, straight line and reflex.

On Tuesday, Year 4 thoroughly enjoyed visiting the Hindu Temple in Crawley. When they arrived, the children were welcomed with a traditional Hindu Bindi by Has, who showed them around, then observed a Hindu service taken by the Hindu priest.
