#### Remembrance Day Service, Sunday 11th November 2018

St Peter and St Paul's Church and Christ Church will join together on Sunday 11th November for the annual Remembrance Day Service. The service will begin at the War Memorial at the top of Mid Street at 10.15am. It will then move to St Peter and St Paul's Church where the service will resume at 10.45am.

November 11th 2018 marks 100 years since the end of World War 1 and the government has invited churches and cathedrals across the country to ring out bells to commemorate this centenary. Bells will also ring in Germany to replicate the outpouring of relief that took place in 1918 and to mark the peace and friendship that is now enjoyed between our two nations. Everyone attending the service is invited to bring any sort of bell they might have to join in the commemorative ringing of bells.

## **Operation Christmas Child**

As part of our 'Love Project' for the autumn term we are asking families to support Operation Christmas Child. Operation Christmas Child is a project of 'Samaritan's Purse', a Christian international relief organisation. Their mission is to provide children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster or famine by sending shoeboxes filled with gifts. The shoe box is usually wrapped with Christmas gift paper and filled with small toys, hygiene items and school supplies. If you would like to support this project, please could your child bring a shoe box filled with gifts into school by Friday 16<sup>th</sup> November. #### **Parents' Evening**

Online bookings open on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> November and appointments will take place in your child's classroom and last for 15 minutes. We will invite Parents of children with additional needs to attend a longer appointment (30 minutes). These are optional and tend to be arranged outside of Parents' Evening week.

#### **Nasal Flu Immunisation Programme**

The Children & Family Health Team Surrey will be coming in to school on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> November 2018 to administer the Nasal Flu Immunisation Programme. This year, the programme is open to all children in Years R to Year 5. Your child will be coming home with an envelope which contains details and an information leaflet explaining what is involved. There is also a Consent Form enclosed in this envelope. Please return the completed form in the envelope provided and return to the school office by Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> November 2018. All information on the form is confidential. If we do not receive a form for your child they will not take part in the programme
