This week

The children have all really enjoyed engaging with our role play shop in the classroom. They have been using our pretend money to buy different food and have been using their Maths learning to help them. They have taken it in turns to be the shop keeper, shelf stocker or customer.

The children have also become Fire Fighters in our outside area role play. They have been using phones and walkie-talkies to report a 'fire' and have been using buckets to put 'fires' out.



English

This week's learning has been linked to our Phonics learning. The children have been working hard to write the tricky words: 'the', 'to', 'no' and 'go', have been begun to read simple sentences. We read 'the pig is red' as a class

Phonics

The children have been practising reading the tricky words 'the', 'to', 'no' and 'go'. The children have learnt hand gestures to help them remember these tricky words. I'm sure your children would love to show you!

Maths

This week, the children have been learning about money! They have looked at the coins and have discussed when we use money and why. They have been using this knowledge to buy food in our shop role play. There is an optional matching activity stuck in for you to try at home!
