

We have had the second very exciting visit from a mystery Superhero who needs Reception's help!

This week

The children were very excited to hear footsteps across the roof both last Monday and this Monday. We saw a letter thrown from the roof which gave Reception a special challenge for their help. The first challenge was to design their own superhero with superpowers. The class have worked so hard on their writing and have used their excellent Phonics knowledge to write words and simple sentences about their superhero.



English

Reception have been designing their own superhero and thinking carefully about which super power they would like to have. For this, the children have been working hard to use their Phonics knowledge to help them spell the words.

The class have been learning about what we need to write a sentence. The children have been working hard to use finger spaces (the gaps between words) in their writing and remembering a full stop at the end!

Phonics

We have recapped all of the phonemes we covered before Christmas and learnt 'ng' (ring), 'ee' (bee), 'oo' (boot) and 'ai' (rain). The children have also been thinking about segmenting and blending words to help them write them, for example b-oo-t.

Maths

The children have been counting their movements. We have been counting how many jumps, hops, leaps and big and small steps it takes to move between two points. This has also encouraged the children to practise writing the digits.
