The children were excited to get a visit from Reverend Phe this week. She spoke to the class about superheroes and the qualities and characteristics they often have. English

The class have enjoyed finding different objects and then putting them in height order. There is an activity for you to try in your books. The aim is to cut out the pictures and stick them in in height order.
