



Year 3 Homework Letter - Friday 21st June 2019

Our Learning This Week

English

This week in English we have finished studying 'The Heart and the Bottle' by Oliver Jeffers. The children have been writing up each part of their plans into full paragraphs, successfully applying different grammatical features. These have included, fronted adverbials, verbs, adverbs, nouns, adjectives and direct speech. Next week we shall be starting our final text of Year 3. During the course of the week the children have participated in assessments for reading and comprehension. This has involved the children reading and answering questions, under assessment conditions, based on a piece of non-fiction, fiction and poetry. The class all conducted themselves well and have received feedback as to how they did.

Maths

This week in Maths the children have been learning about angles; embedding their understanding of right angles, acute and obtuse angles. We looked at identifying angle types using everyday contexts such as a clock face. We proceeded by developing our understanding of how many degrees are in a turn. The children worked practically outside, working with a partner they guided each other around the space using physical instructions to tell their partner what turn to make. For, example tapping them on the right shoulder three times was instructing them to make a $\frac{3}{4}$ turn clockwise. As with English, a proportion of our week was spent doing a Maths assessment of the work we have covered in Year 3. The children did well and have had their marks back.

This week we continued studying the Sikh faith. The children learnt about Guru Nanak, the founder of Sikhism. We studied his life story and placed it into a historical context of other world religions. The children were able to recognise that Sikhism is a relatively new religion having been established in the 15th Century.

Homework

This week's English activities are to learn the spellings for Week 2 of Term 3A, to practise those spellings using cursive script and to complete the activity. For Maths the children must practise their 8 times tables out of sequence and complete the activity on angles. There will be a spelling and times table test next Friday.

St Peter and St Paul's Festival

On 29th and 30th June 2-5pm St Peter and St Paul Church is open for tea and home-made cake. The church will be decorated with floral arrangements and there will be an opportunity to look around this ancient building and even try bell-ringing! This week, in support of this event, the children have designed bunting flags based on the school value of joy, they considered what brought them joy. The bunting will be hung in the church during the festival.
