Our Learning This Week

We have started a new book in English lessons this week - 'Westlandia' by Paul Fleischman. Wesley is an unconventional boy who decides to build his own civilisation in his back garden. The children have been reading the story and focusing on the sophisticated language. They have learnt how to write complex sentences using subordinate clauses and how to use a dictionary to check the meanings of words and a thesaurus to look for synonyms.

In Maths this week, we have been concentrating on division - using the short written ('bus stop') method and dividing and multiplying by 10, 100 and 1000.

In Art & Design, the children have been designing a 3D model of the Iron Man which they will be moulding in clay and then using electrical lights circuits to switch their model's eyes on and off.
