### English

This week we began reading our new text *'Rosie Revere, Engineer'* by *Andrea Beaty*. At the beginning of the week we started to look at the technical vocabulary related to bridge architecture and then used this terminology to create short explanation sentences using the conjunction *'when'*. Towards the end of the week the children looked at using the suffixes *'-ing, -ness and -ment'* in their writing.

### Maths

During our learning this week Year 2 have been looking at using money correctly. We were learning to identify money and the different combinations of coins and notes that can be used to reach the same amount. The children have incorporated many of the skills they have used throughout the year, such as addition and subtraction methods.
