English

The children have been writing their own sentences based on a range of pictures. We have linked this to our Phonics learning and using the consonant blends.

For example: the parrot went down the plank.

Maths

The class have been reinforcing their understanding of numbers and placing them in the correct order. The children have been making towers using blocks of different numbers and building them up to 20.

E.g. If you have 17, how many more do you need to add to make 20?

Phonics

This week, the children have continued to practise reading words with 'consonant blends' at the beginning or the end. A consonant blend is a group of two or three consonants in a word that makes a distinct consonant sound, such as 'bl' or 'spl'.
