1. Anti-Bullying Charter Mark timetable for the day

AB welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked the team for their commitment this year.

The proposed timetable for the day of the Anti-Bullying Chartermark (Wednesday 10th July) was shared and discussed. AB said it would be great if the Partnership could be represented, JV and LB volunteered to attend.

AB shared the folder of evidence. LHM looked through the range of evidence and a few amendments were noted, including a typo and the need to clarify on the timetable the reason adults are available on the playground each day is to provide an opportunity before and after school for parents and children discuss any issues, including bullying.

2. Review of the term / year – WWW, EBI

PH suggested that the Spelling Bee link to Anti-Bullying words was a little tenuous and some of the words could be perceived as negative. AB suggested it was unlikely that Anti-Bullying would be used again in this way.

LHM commented that the annual parent questionnaire did not provide the opportunity for respondents explain their answers and a comment section with each question would be helpful. AB noted the suggestion and commented that parents who had not strongly agreed with statements in the questionnaire had not come forward to give further feedback, despite this request being made in the newsletter.

There was a long discussion about the content of the NSPCC visit. Everyone agreed it was important for the children to be exposed to the messages at an age appropriate way and LB, who had accompanied a class during the visit said how well the talk had been pitched. PH suggested a summary of the content would be useful for parents. It was thought that perhaps the Year 3 children had not fully understood the KS2 talk and if we reran the workshops in a couple of years' time, we may consider grouping years 1 – 3 and years 4 – 6.

AB and LB remarked on what a successful year it had been for Anti-Bullying and how well the Random Acts of Kindness was going. The children are actively seeking out ways to notice and praise each other.

Unfortunately, we were unable to partner with Brooklands special school during our work on Dignity. We will try and arrange this for next year, however, with Summer 1 being a very short term and also navigating SATS, this may take place in Summer 2 instead.

3.Planning next year

It was felt the idea of utilising the hall during Parents' Evenings to raise awareness of issues such as bullying and online safety had worked well and should continue next year.

It was agreed that Parents' Evening was a great opportunity to hand out information to parents along with the regular targets and academic updates from teachers. This would inform parents about the work their children had been doing about anti-bullying and give them an idea of what to ask/discuss at home.

AB shared the school's rationale for Love projects and said they would be returning in Autumn term.

AB thanked the group for their contributions and encouraged any other ideas via the playground or email.
