Dear Parents and Carers

### **Values**

At Nutfield Church School we have six core, Christian values. This term our values are 'Community' and 'Hope'. Our focussed Love Project will be the Winter Night Shelter. We will be supporting this charity through our Harvest service which is held at Christ Church. Everyone (including babes in arms and other siblings) are most welcome.

### **Harvest Gifts for Renewed Hope Trust 2019**

Christ Church PCC would like to ask the children in each year group at Nutfield Church School to collect a specific item. The aim is to help the children to understand what someone with no home, who doesn't know where they will be sleeping from one night to another, needs to survive.

Please could you help by encouraging your child to bring an item specified for their particular year; the item should be well within its 'use by' date and of good quality.

In conjunction with the Renewed Hope Trust (Winter Night Shelter), the following items are required: Year R: Bars of chocolate -large or small – and bags of sweets, Year 1: Packets of biscuits (no digestives -thank you), Year 2: Tins of vegetables -especially carrots, peas and potatoes (no red kidney beans or sweetcorn), Year 3: Tins of meat or meat in sauces or meat pies, Year 4: Tins of fruit and cartons of readymade custard, Year 5: Coffee, sugar and fruit squash, Year 6: Men's toiletries eg deodorant, shampoo or soap (no toothbrushes)

The Renewed Hope Trust are not able to make use of dry pasta or soup. Donations can come in any time from next week. They will be delivered to church a few days before the service on 11<sup>th</sup> October.

### **Meet the Teacher Meetings**

For those of you who are new to the school, a 'Meet the Teacher' meeting is simply a meeting where the teacher meets with the whole parent group. These meetings are held in your child's classroom. Your children (school aged or otherwise) are welcome to come along. You simply pick your child up from the playground and instead of leaving you come past the wooden gate in the playground and enter the school via your child's class door. The meetings are held in September, so you have plenty of time to understand what is happening throughout the year, what days PE are on, how reading, homework, uniform, behaviour, etc. work! It also gives you the opportunity to ask any questions you may have at the beginning of the year. Please do come along.

## After School Clubs 19/20

Over the past six months, the staff team and I have been planning around our new curriculum and wider opportunities that we offer in the school. We have considered teacher work load, specialisms, parent volunteers ideas, music volunteers suggestions and financial implications of course!

We have enjoyed working with James from Fletcher's Feathers through his badminton club and so have invited him to coach here at school this year. This enables us to offer a broad range of professionally coached sports. We are calling these clubs 'External Clubs' to differentiate from clubs led by staff which we will refer to as 'Internal Clubs'.

External clubs are staffed by professional coaches and can be booked and paid for through the Fletcher's Feathers website. Internal clubs will be staffed by teachers or volunteers and can be applied for via the usual letter system. Letters for the Autumn clubs will go out today (Friday 6<sup>th</sup> September 2019). Spring and Summer clubs letters will go out at the start of each new term.

You will notice from the clubs overview attached, that External and Internal clubs start and end on different weeks. To be as organised as possible for your family diaries, we have planned the whole year. The ladies in the office have been very helpful with this.

## **School Teams**

We will be voting for our new school teams in the next few weeks in class and are in need of badges for our new representatives. If your child was a member of Faith Team, Eco Team and or School Council and still has their badge please could you send it in to the school office in an envelope or ask your child to pass on to their new class teacher. As part of our work on well-being and British Values we will be focussing on Democracy. As part of this work each class will nominate candidates for a 'Pupils' Parliament'. The Pupils' Parliament will be a School Council with a three strand foci – School Events – The Environment (focussing on attaining Green Flag status) and Well-Being.

## **School Meals – Autumn Term 2019**

We hope that those children who have been having full time school meals have enjoyed the variety of meals on offer over the past year. They represent excellent value for money. Surrey Commercial Services have slightly increased the cost of meals for this academic year. Meals will now cost £2.35 per day, £11.75 weekly or £86.95 for the 1st half of the autumn term to the 25<sup>th</sup> October 2019. Thank you to those Parents who have already made payments. You can pay online if you have an account set up. If you would like details of how to set up an account please ask the school office for an access letter. You can also pay by cash or cheque payable to Surrey Commercial Services. Please ensure prompt payment to save the school office having to contact you.

## **Nasal Flu Programme**

Our school will be taking part in the national nasal flu programme on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2019. For the first time this programme will be offered to the whole school. The consent forms for this programme are now accessible online. You will find a letter attached to this newsletter which gives all the details of how you access this programme and put your child's name down if you agree to them taking part. If you do not complete a form your child will not be offered the nasal flu spray. The closing date for the e-consent form to be completed is Friday 18<sup>th</sup> October 2019.
